FAMILY LAW CLINICS

Offered twice monthly, these clinics can assist with simple divorce, custody, and child support matters for low income residents. Clinic participants must meet strict financial eligibility standards established by the federal government (live at or below 200% of the federal poverty line), not have liquid assets, own substantial property, or have an interest in a pension. If you believe you might qualify *after reading the information on this flier*, call 812.402.6303 for an appointment.

NON-FAMILY LAW CLINICS (HOUSING, DEBT, OTHER ISSUES)

Offered twice monthly, this clinic can assist self-represented litigants with basic information about the Courts and resources available to address general legal needs, like small claims matters, evictions, debt collections, BMV fee waivers, etc. You do not have to have an appointment or a referral to attend this general clinic.
