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Family Planning

Family Planning provides services to women and men of reproductive age. Services offered include:

- Annual exams
- Breast exams
- Diagnosis and treatment of STDs
- FDA approved birth control
- Pregnancy testing
- HIV testing
- Counseling, education, and referrals
- Confidential services are provided on a sliding scale fee.

Healthy Families

Healthy Families offers services to parents expecting a child and families with a baby younger than three months old, who live in Dubois, Gibson, Pike, Spencer, or Warrick Counties.

Services offered include support, information, and referrals in:

- Child development
- Prenatal care
- Education
- Goal setting
- Employment

Healthcare Resource Navigator

Free, (not income based) unbiased, confidential services from a certified resource navigator providing one-on-one guidance and enrollment assistance in applying for:

- Medicaid
- ACA Marketplace health insurance
- Medicare

Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP)

The Retired & Senior Volunteer Program is a network for people 55 and over who want to give back to their communities through rewarding and significant service activities. Benefits and recognition are offered.

Energy Assistance Program

The Energy Assistance Program provides financial assistance to low income households (income guidelines) to maintain utility services during the winter heating season.

Individual Development Accounts

The IDA program assists low to moderate income Hoosiers attain their goals through matched savings incentives and financial education. Qualified participants set savings goals and make regular deposits. Every \$1.00 dollar you save is matched at a rate of \$3.00 to help you reach your goals.

Affordable Senior and Family Housing

In Huntingburg, Indiana, Stork Place Apartments provide 17 affordable senior housing units and Wagon Works Apartments provide 56 affordable housing units. Additionally, five single family homes have been renovated and provide affordable family housing.

Housing Counseling:

Housing counseling services to guide and assist clients to become financially fit. TRI-CAP offers HUD certified pre-purchase education courses, budgeting and credit counseling, financial literacy seminars, mortgage default, delinquency, and foreclosure prevention assistance.

For families with more than eight persons, add \$5,140 for each additional person.

Any child ages three to five is eligible, however, TRI-CAP Head Start will serve children with the highest needs first.

This means all categorically (SSI, TANF, & Foster) and income eligible children are served first.
