## RE-ENTRY PROGRAM

Aurora's Re-Entry program assists offenders who are homeless or are at risk of becoming homeless to find housing and necessary services. Our goal is to fully integrate the offender into the community and reduce recidivism while promoting a safer community.



## What does Aurora's Re-Entry Program provide?

- A case manager who partners with the client and the offender's parole/probation officers and other community agencies to identify what services would be most beneficial for the client.
- Support to assist the client in finding and maintaining, affordable, and stable housing.
- Short-term rental assistance
- Develop a Re-Entry plan and establish healthy relationships within the community

## Am I Eligible?

- Been convicted of a felony, have been incarcerated/sentenced to a minimum 1 year DOC/BOP, and released in the last 6 months
- Must be below 60% of the area median income (AMI) of the Evansville and Henderson Metro Area
- Have the ability to obtain income
- Facing a housing crisis (can not be in an active lease)
